Sharing of Learning Opportunity - *Friday 1st February*

Maths

I am learning to gather, present and analyse information.

- Cool - ask your friends and family what their favourite sport is (or a different question of your choice) - create a tally chart to show the results.
- Hot - use the information gathered in the cool task to make a bar graph. (This may include using technology)
- Spicy - complete hot task then create questions for your maths group to answer about your bar graph.

Technology

Craft, Design and Engineering

I am learning about the engineering principles of different kinds of bridges. In our local area there are lots of bridges. Look for them when you are out and about.

- **Cool** - Draw one or two local bridges, write some facts about them; what they carry, where they are located etc.
- **Hot** - Draw the three famous bridges that cross the Forth. Find out what type of bridges they are and some interesting facts about them
- **Spicy** - Complete hot task then using junk/recycling make a model of a bridge. Bring in a photo or the model to show us.

Literacy

I can select, organise and convey information in different ways.

We are exploring a range of non-fiction books in class.

- Cool - Write a few sentences describing your favourite hobby.
- Hot - Write a few paragraphs about your favourite pastime. Sort your information into paragraphs.
- Spicy - Make a small book about your favourite pastime. Include a contents page, headings and subheadings.
